Nadereh Chamlou is an international development advisor. She was formerly a Senior Advisor at the World Bank. Over her three-decade career with the World Bank Group, she held managerial, technical, coordination, and advisory functions in diverse geographical regions and in such fields as economic management, corporate governance, private sector development, financial markets, knowledge economy, environment, infrastructure, and gender and development.

Her emphasis has been on private sector development and promotion of growth and competitiveness through fair utilization of the talent pool, diversity, and inclusion. She co-authored the World Bank flagship publication on "Corporate Governance: A Framework for Implementation," which led to the establishment of the World Bank/OECD-sponsored Global Corporate Governance Forum; she headed its Secretariat from 1998-2000. Other publications include "Gender and Development in the MENA Region - Women in the Public Sphere" (2003); "The Environment for Women's Entrepreneurship in the MENA Region" (2008); and "Women, Work, Welfare in the MENA Region" (2016). She was founding member of the World Bank-sponsored Gender Economic Research and Policy Analysis (GERPA) initiative; served on the scientific committee of the Dutch Gender Task Force, and taught as Adjunct Professor at New York University's Wagner School for Public Policy.

More recently, Mrs. Chamlou has engaged with organizations and initiatives that focus on innovation and entrepreneurship while stressing women's potential in these domains. Among others, she is member of the Board of Berkeley University's iBridge initiative for IT entrepreneurship; advisor to the Center for International Private Enterprise; member of the International Advisory Committee of Nyenrode Business Universiteit in The Netherlands; member of the Board of the Arab International Women's Forum; advisor to the Board of the Center for Arab Women's Training and Research; and founding member of "The Billion Dollar Fund" - a funder's consortium for women-founded businesses. She speaks frequently at international fora and media on issues related to women's empowerment. She attended Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service and Graduate School of Economics. She received the 2015 "Making a Difference" Award from The Global Alliance for Women.
